

A Call for Prayer from Pastor Thomas

As pastor of a Church I am always trying to evaluate what the Lord would have us do, to make sure that our actions as a body of believers line up with God's will. God's desire is for us to seek Him as the first step. We can then learn what His will is for ourselves personally and for our Church is instead of doing what seems right, and then asking God to bless our actions.

God's leading in our life must be our first priority (Matthew 6:33).

Considering this command to seek first the Kingdom, I would like to invite our Church into a season of prayer that I believe Jesus is inviting us into.

Pray for everyone

Often our prayers can be very self-focused. As we seek the Lord, he moves our attention to others. This is often known as intercessory prayer, where we ask God to meet the needs of others. As we pray together as a church we don't want to focus only on our own personal issues. The Lord has called us to pray for all people.

1 Timothy 2: 1-4 and 8 Says "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.... Therefore I want the men everywhere to pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or disputing.

Let us make time to practice loving our neighbours as ourselves as we pray together for others.

Jesus Said

This month we begin a new series looking at the words of Jesus found in the Gospel of Luke.

The Gospel of Luke was written sometime between 60 and 80 A.D. by Luke, a Gentile physician and the missionary companion of Paul. This is the first of two volumes Luke wrote for Theophilus. The second is the Book of Acts. While Luke addresses his book to Theophilus, which means "one who loves God" it is intended for all believers.

The NIV Study Notes explaint that, "The fact that the Gospel was initially directed to Theophilus does not narrow or limit its purpose. It was written to strengthen the faith of all believers and to answer the attacks of unbelievers. Luke wanted to show that the place of the Gentile Christian in God's Kingdom is based on the teaching of Jesus."

Don't Stop Praying

A lack of time is a major issue in today's world. How do I fit prayer into my schedule? I don't think I can make it to the prayer meeting. I want to pray but so many other things are keeping me busy. These are issues that everyone deals with, but let us remember these words from the Bible:

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18
Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

God's will is that we never stop. You don't have to make it to every prayer meeting, you can still pray without giving up your job or time with others. Simply find ways to communicate to God throughout the day. Do you get a 15-minute break at work? Do you give thanks for your meals? What do you do when you are in the car? Can you afford to get up a few minutes early or go to sleep a few minutes later? There are many simple ways to pray. It is God's desire that we are in constant communication with Him. Pray before you start your next task, make your next phone call or when you have any moment to re-centre yourself on God.

Praying is a responsibility

We often think of sin as things that we do that make God upset with us, when, in reality sin is as simply being outside of God's will. God's will is that we are in Him and He in us. God's will is that we talk to Him. Have you ever thought that when you fail to communicate with Him then you are neglecting your relationship with Him? The prophet Samuel understood this and took his responsibility so seriously that he thought that if he didn't pray then he would be in sin.

1 Samuel 12:23 As for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the Lord by failing to pray for you.

And I will teach you the way that is good and right.

My intention is not to make you feel guilty if you have failed to pray but I desire that we see prayer as a part of our lives, which if neglected, can hurt our relationship with God. If we take this responsibility seriously, then prayer will not be a burden but a blessing.

Prayer brings healing

We live in a world filled with bad news. You can't turn on the radio, TV, computer or cell phone without seeing how broken the world is. The good news is that we have the answer, God has given us the ability to seek Him for healing. He has promised to answer when we call.

2 Chronicles 7:14 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land

Our desire to see healing, to see a change in our world, should empower our desire to seek the face of God. The Lord has called us to His throne with boldness (Hebrews 4:16 Let us join together in unity to see God hear our cries for our family, our friends, our neighbours, our enemies and the world.

Luke is one of the three Synoptic Gospels, meaning Matthew, Mark, and Luke tell many of the same events from Jesus' life. We find many similarities between their accounts. It is the differences that help us understand each authors emphasis. Luke is writing to a primarily Gentile audience. He wants them the understand the way to find salvation is in Jesus, that all people are welcomed into the Kingdom of God, and an importance of praising God.

He also has a focus on prayer, the poor and social justice, the role of women, and the work of the Holy Spirit. Luke includes more parables than any other gospel.
